# FOUNDRESS MOTHER TERESA of St. Rose of Lima (1858-1902)

Mother Teresa was born on 29 January 1858 at Chennai, to devote catholic parents and was christened Mary Grace. She lost her mother at a young age, but her father gave her all the love, support and excellent education that



fitted her for her future apostolate. When 18, she was invited to Aleppey in Kerala to teach in a school run by the Carmelite priests. The school was not in a proper condition when she took over, but she quickly turned it into a success story. During this period, Mary Grace became a Carmelite sister herself and in 1884 she was professed and given the name Sr. Teresa of St. Rose of Lima. Sr. Teresa later became a teacher at St. Joseph's Convent at Aleppey and started living a religious life according to the regulations of the sisters of the Third Order of our lady of Mt. Carmel. In 1887 she was given a higher responsibility and asked to go to Ernakulam to educate and care for the oppressed people there. It was at Ernakulam that Sr. Teresa founded the Congregation of Carmelite sisters of St. Teresa on April 24, 1887. During this period, she responded in a prophetic way to the demands of the gospel and the church and led the marginalized sections of society to experience human dignity and secure their rightful place by building "a civilization of love". Soon, she became a 'mother' to the poor and the outcast. Mother Teresa and her congregation became the pride of the neighbourhood with its service for the sick, the dying, unwed mothers and orphans, and its free soup kitchen for the famine-hit public. In just 15 years, Mother Teresa placed the congregation on a strong foundation, braving all the challenges. Mother Teresa's dynamic and missionary life came to a tragic end on September 12, 1902 when the train in which she was travelling fell into a river in Andhra Pradesh, following a sudden and violent storm burst. Though deeply hit by her sudden departure, the congregation continued its life of prayer, apostolic work and public service under her inspiration and gradually grew into a widely respected institution. Today the congregation works in more than 120 communities worldwide in schools, colleges, technical schools, social work and social action centres, hospitals, hospices, homes for the aged and the sick, orphanages and prisons, centres for the development of women, men and children and the like.

# REGULATIONS FOR NATIONAL EDUCATIONAL POLICY (NEP)

The National Education Policy of India 2020 (NEP 2020), approved by the Union Cabinet of India on 29 July 2020, outlines the vision of India's new education system. The new policy replaces the previous National Policy on Education, 1986. The policy is a comprehensive framework for elementary education to higher education as well as vocational training in both rural and

urban India. The policy aims to transform India's education system by 2040

#### **Student Activity and Participation**

Students are the prime stakeholders in the education system. Vibrant campus life is essential for high-quality teaching-learning processes. Towards this end, students will be given plenty of opportunities for participation in sports, culture/arts clubs, ecoclubs, activity clubs, community service projects, etc.

The structure and lengths of degree programmes shall be adjusted accordingly. The undergraduate degree will be of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple exit options within this period, with appropriate certifications, such as follows:

- + A certificate after completing 1 year in a discipline
- + A diploma after 2 years of study,
- + A Bachelor's degree after a 3-year programme.
- + The 4-year multidisciplinary Bachelor's programme, however, shall be the preferred option since it allows the opportunity to experience the full range of holistic and multidisciplinary education in addition to a focus on the chosen major and minors as per the choices of the student.



# REGULATIONS FOR CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

#### **UG: Programme structure**

- The UG degree program is of six semesters with 144 credits in total.
- + An academic year has two semesters odd and even.
- A semester extends over 20 weeks inclusive of semester end examination.
- Every course offered may have 3 components: Lecture,
   Tutorial and Practical or any of the two.
- + 1 hour Session of Lecture or Tutorial per week for 16 weeks amounts to 1 credit.
- + 2 hour Session Practical per week is equal to 16 weeks amounts to 1 credit.
- + The credit pattern is formed by the respective BOS.
- + A course of 3 to 6 credits will be evaluated for 100 marks. A course less than 3 credits will be evaluated for 50 marks.

#### Course details:

- 1. Every student should study discipline specific regran College a core requirement based on combination. MYSORE-570 011
- Elective course is chosen from the pool of courses offered and they are classified into.
  - a. DSE-Discipline Specific Elective
  - b. GE-Generic Elective
  - c. AEC-Ability Enhancement Course
  - d. AECC-Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course
  - e. SEC-Skill Enhancement Course
- In the first four semesters a student has to study AEC which includes English and any one Modern Indian language listed in the programme by UoM.

4. It is mandatory for every student to study Environmental Studies (EVS) and Indian Constitution (IC) which will be offered within the 1st two semester of every programme.

In the V and VI semester a student will have the option of

selecting electives offered along with core subjects.

The total credits inclusive of all these will be 144 credits.

#### Evaluation system:

CBCS programme focuses on continuous assessment and skill development. There will be three exams  $C_1$ ,  $C_2$  and  $C_3$ .

+ C<sub>1</sub>- Will be conducted by the 8<sup>th</sup> week of the semester 50% of the syllabus will be included.

+ C<sub>2</sub>- Will be conducted by the 18th week Remaining 50%

of the syllabus will be included.

+ C<sub>3</sub>- Exam will be conducted during 18-20 week as per University notification.

A student cannot skip  $C_1$  and  $C_2$  exam. For the completion of the course a student has to score a minimum of 40% from  $C_1$ ,  $C_2$  and  $C_3$  put together.

 $C_1$  and  $C_2$  will be evaluated by teachers handling the course.

C<sub>3</sub> is centralized evaluation by University of Mysore.

#### PG: Programme Structure

- + The PG Degree programmes are of four semesters with 76 or 80 credits. An academic year has two semesters.
- + A semester has 20 weeks in which 16 weeks for classes and 4 weeks for examinations.
- + Every course has LTP pattern viz., Lecturing (L), Tutorial (T) and Practical (P) with two or four or six or eight credits.
- +One-hour session of Lecture and Tutorial per week for 16 weeks amounts to one credit. Two-hour session of Practical per week for 16 weeks amounts to one credit.
- + There are three types of courses viz., Hard Core (HC), Soft Core (SC) and Open Elective (OE).
- +Hard core courses are compulsory courses. Soft Core courses are elective courses which have to be chosen from the pool of courses. Open Elective courses are to be chosen from the pool of courses offered by other departments.

+ Project work / dissertation is a part of the PG Programmes.

#### LIBRARY AND INFORMATION CENTRE


