1. BSc. Programme

- As few students have disagreed towards the availability of books, it is advised to procure more number of books and study materials.
- Few students are not happy that the curriculum is not designed to enhance the employability. Hence, each department will make an effort to conduct certificate courses, add-on programmes to enrich the employability skills among students.
- As few students have disagreed that the syllabus is not enable to improve ability to formulate / analyse / solve problems. Hence, Department of Science will make an effort to take up more internship programmes and field visits to give students practical exposure to face the challenges and that would influence them to increase their knowledge to meet the industrial requirements.

2. BA Programme

- As few of the students were not happy with the quantum of syllabus is in portion with the time frame, staff of BA Programme will make special efforts to complete the syllabus within time frame.
- At the same time students are not happy that the curriculum is not designed to enhance the employability. Hence, it is advised to conduct certificate courses, add-on programmes to enrich the employability skills among students.
- As few students have disagreed towards the availability of books, it is advised to procure more number of books and study materials.

3. B.Com. Programme

- Few students were not happy that the curriculum is not designed to enhance the employability. Hence, it is advised to conduct certificate courses, add-on programmes to enrich the employability skills among students.
- Department of Commerce has taken initiative to conduct more certificate/ add-on programmes to enhance the employability skills among students.
- As few students have disagreed that the syllabus is not enable to improve ability to formulate/ analyse/ solve problems. Hence, Department of commerce will make an effort to take up more internship programmes and field visits to give students practical exposure to face the challenges.

4. BBA Programme

- As few of the students were not happy with the quantum of syllabus is in portion with the time frame, staff of BBA Programme will make special efforts to complete the syllabus within time frame.
- As few students have disagreed towards the availability of books, it is advised to procure more number of books and study materials.
- At the same time students have disagreed that the curriculum delivery is oriented towards life skills. Hence, it is advised to conduct certificate courses, add-on programmes/ Life skill programmes which include role play, debate, GD, case studies, brainstorming, etc., to enrich the life skills among students.

5. MSc. Biotechnology

- As few students have disagreed towards the availability of books, it is advised to procure more number of foreign author books to enhance the students knowledge.
- Few students are not happy that the curriculum is not designed to enhance the employability. Hence, Department of Biotechnology will make an effort to conduct certificate courses, add-on programmes to enrich the employability skills among students.
- As few students have disagreed that the syllabus is not enable to improve ability to formulate / analyse / solve problems. Hence, Department of Biotechnology will make an effort to take up more internship programmes, field visits and skill development programmes in association with industries to give students practical exposure to face the challenges and that would influence them to increase their knowledge to meet the industrial requirements.

6. M.Com.

- Majority of the students have either agreed or strongly agreed to the various statements used to measure the students' feedback on curriculum. At the same, time negligible number of students have disagreed and some of them have stayed neutral.
- Hence, it can be interpreted that the students of Post-Graduate Department of Commerce are satisfied with the syllabus, quantum of syllabus, time frame, assessment methods, employability opportunities, availability of books, and curriculum delivery. They have also stated that the course / Programme has helped them in pursuing higher education and the syllabus has enabled them to acquire necessary knowledge and skills that are required to meet the job requirements. 7. MA English













8. MSc. Psychology

- Department of Psychology will take initiative to conduct more certificate/ add-on programmes to enhance their skills.


Committee members approved the suggestions given by the Deans and HOD's of respective streams and advised to inculcate the same.
